Students are expected to put in a minimum of 224 hours (an average of 16 hours a week for 14 weeks) for 4-credit In-House Clinics and for Externships (in addition to the classroom component), and a minimum of 168 hours (an average of 12 hours a week for 14 weeks) for 3-credit In-House Clinics.
