

Welcome from the Director of the Public Interest Center

Welcome to the 2025 Public Interest Awards - I am so glad you are here celebrating with us. This has been a year of growth and adjustment for the Public Interest Center. Some of our regular pro bono opportunities were disrupted by the change in the federal administration but we have persisted and are determined to meet the challenges ahead.

We started the school year in August with Public Service Day. At Public Service Day, 210 students participated in volunteer experiences with 15 non-profit organizations; and we engaged 26 upper division law students as volunteers to assist the first-year law students in finding their way around.

In October, a group of twenty students participated in the annual Chicago Bar Association/Chicago Bar Foundation Pro Bono Fair and the enthusiasm of the students led to a new partnership. Students' interest was so great in volunteering with the Legal Aid Society's Elder Justice Initiative Power of Attorney Clinic that we spun off our first-ever Spring Break pro bono week. Although the week was limited to two opportunities, the hope is to grow this tradition in future years.

We continued to support monthly pro bono activities. Throughout the year, students used their 711 licenses to represent child clients in guardian ad litem cases under the supervision of Chicago Volunteer Legal Services. We continued to partner with Legal Aid Chicago on their monthly Austin Clinic, meeting the community's civil legal needs. Our monthly Immigration Clinics with the Children's Legal Center were paused for several months, to re-group due to the administrative change – but have now continued. In exciting news, the border trip that the Immigration Law Society held for three years, but has not gone on since prior to Covid, is now on again – with a group of students going to the New Mexico Immigrant Law Center in May.

In year three of the Public Interest Center, we expanded our outreach to Alumni and Community Partners through a Public Interest Center newsletter. We held a "Welcome Back" event in February for students to engage with Chicago-Kent alumni. In our efforts to support future public interest lawyers, we are set to launch the Public Interest Career Advisory Network through which alumni and friends can sign up to be a resource to current students. Additionally, we are holding our first Illinois Legal Answers Clinic on June 12th during which Chicago-Kent alumni and students will partner to answer civil legal aid questions. We are seeking alumni volunteers.


We are proud to be fulfilling our Mission to increase pro bono and community service and support careers in public interest law for Chicago-Kent students, while expanding access to justice in the community. Our goal is to engage every Chicago-Kent student in at least 50 hours of pro bono during law school, helping to foster a mindset of using legal skills to give to others that will hopefully last their entire professional career.

2025 Recipient of the Vivien C. Gross Pro Bono & Public Interest Award: Joseph Strom




This year's winner of the Viven C. Gross Pro Bono and Public interest Leadership Award is Joseph Strom. Joseph is deeply committed to Public Interest Law and Pro Bono as demonstrated by the copious amount of pro bono engagement, public interest internships, and leadership roles he has had throughout law school.

Joseph volunteered with 18 different community organizations in law school - the majority of those hours spent at Legal Aid Chicago, the Children's Legal Center, the Self-Help Resource Center, Administer Justice, the Puerto Rican Bar Association, Mexican American Legal Defense and Education Fund, and the Community Christian Church Lincoln Park.

Joseph is a leader at Chicago-Kent, serving as president of the
