Spring 2026 J.D. Catalog and Schedule of Classes

Updated: November 11, 2025

Welcome to the Summer 2026 session. Courses during the Summer session are not split up by Day or Evening Division, as all non-clinical courses meet at 4pm or after. For information about the graduation requirements for J.D. students or the list of the faculty's recommended courses for upper-level students, see the Spring 2026 course catalog.

A few notes:

- Credit Hour Limits: With the exception noted just below, students may take a maximum of 6 credit hours in the Summer term; there is no minimum. Exceptions: (1) Students who take a 4- credit Clinic or Externship course may take a total of 7 credits; and (2) students who take Software Patents may take a total of 8 credits. Any student taking more than 6 credits should contact Dean Tierney (law-academicaffairs@illinoistech.edu) so that your maximum credit limit can be adjusted in the registration system.
- Course Fee: A course fee of \$350, in addition to regular tuition, will be charged to full-time students for regular classroom courses taken during the Summer term, including any courses taken through our consortium programs with DePaul, Loyola, and UIC, and including classes taken through other ABA-accredited schools. Exceptions: (1) The fee does not apply to part-time students (for any course); (2) the fee does not apply (for any student) to clinical courses, externships, or Independent Research credits pursued at Chicago-Kent; and (3) the fee does not apply (for any student) to courses taken through Chicago-Kent exchange programs with universities abroad. If the fee applies to you and you qualify for financial aid loans, those can be used to cover the cost of the fee; scholarships, however, cannot be used to cover the cost of the fee. Note to part-time students: You may see the course fee on your account if you take a regular classroom course; a credit equal to the fee will be applied to offset the charge at the end of the Summer add/drop period.
- In each table of classes, the 'Course Meetings' column tells when the class meets, and R means Thursday. The 'Note?' column tells when you should look at the footnotes below the table for more information.

Note 1: *This is a specialized section of Evidence; you may not take this course if you have taken, or plan to take, the regular Evidence course. This course is designed to present evidence from the perspective of a trial lawyer and is aimed at students who plan a career in criminal or civil litigation. The material will cover a traditional evidence curriculum while demonstrating how the rules are actually used and argued in the adversarial process. It will be an interactive class in which students will spend a great deal of time solving evidentiary problems, arguing opposing sides, while mastering the rules. Preference will be given to students newly-accepted onto Trial Team. Note: If you register for this course, you will be required to register for the Intensive Trial Advocacy 1 class in August (registration for that class will take place as part of Fall 2026 registration), and then Trial Advocacy 2 in the regular Fall semester.

3 Clinical and Experiential Education Courses

3.1 Clinical Education Courses with Chicago-Kent Law Group clinics

Permission is **required** for admission to all clinical programs. Registration is subject to the clinical department's permission. You can learn more at the clinic's applications and enrollment page (link). Please look out for additional announcements about the process.

All In-House and Externship clinical programs are graded on a pass/low pass/fail basis only, with the exception of Pretrial Litigation, Intensive Clinic, and Intensive Clinic seminar, which are graded on a letter grade basis. Students are expected to put in a minimum of 182 hours (an average of 14 hours a week for 13 weeks) for 4-credit In-House Clinics and for Externships (in addition to the classroom component), and a minimum of 143 hours (an average of 11 hours a week for 13 weeks) for 3-credit In-House Clinics. Students must be available at the days and times designated below to meet with supervising attorneys and at other times as required by the supervising attorneys.

Note: The environmental law clinic has a prerequisite of Civil Procedure. Pass/fail only. For the one-credit version, there is no classroom component, and instructor approval is required. Students are required to perform 5 hours a week of fieldwork for the one-credit version, 10 hours a week of fieldwork for the 3-credit version, and 12 hours a week of fieldwork for the 4-credit version, in addition to the classroom component.

The on-line application must be submitted for consideration no later than one week before the first day of classes (Tuesday, January 13, 2026), and registration completed no later than the business day before the first day of classes (Friday, January 16, 2026).
