This catalog includes our proposed course offerings for Academic Year 2026-27 for LL.M. and Exchange students. We have a separate catalog with course offerings for our J.D. students. LL.M. and Exchange students should only use **this course catalog**.

- This catalog covers **Fall 2026** and **Spring 2027**. Each table includes a **Semester** column indicating when the course is offered. Updates on the availability of courses will be provided to you during the LL.M. & Exchange Student Orientation and throughout the fall semester.
- All LL.M. students must complete a minimum total of 24 credit hours to graduate.
- All full-time LL.M. & Exchange Students must register for a minimum of 12 credit hours per semester.
- LL.M. & Exchange Students may take a maximum of 16 credits per semester. An advising session and approval is required from Associate Dean Adam Weber if a student seeks to register for more than 16 credits in a semester.
- All LL.M. & Exchange students must complete an academic advising session prior to their first registration term and submit their approved advising sheet to Senior Program Coordinator Daniele Acciari. Students are expected to register for the courses approved by their academic advisors unless the course no longer has availability.
- Students are expected to fill out their course advising forms completely, including the course code, section number, and CRN.¹
- The course advising forms are for the Fall 2026 term only. Do not include any Spring 2027 courses in your advising form since this information is solely provided to help facilitate your selections for the upcoming term and give you awareness of what may be offered next semester.
- Restricted Courses: Registration is restricted for LL.M. & Exchange Students to Legal Writing 4, all Trial Advocacy courses (only available to TA LLM students), Ethics & Advocacy (only available to TA LLM students), and the fall Business Organizations sections (only available to GBFL students). If approved, you will be registered for these classes by Associate Dean Weber and will not be able to register for them on your own in the system.
- Approval from Associate Dean Weber is required for independent studies and must be verified by your LL.M. academic advisor. Additional information on how to get independent study approval and submit a request in TeamDynamix will be provided during orientation.
- No J.D. pre-requisite course restrictions apply to LL.M. students. If you have any issue registering for a course with a J.D. pre-requisite, please contact Associate Dean Adam Weber who will waive the restriction.
- In each table of classes, the 'Course Meetings' column tells when the class meets, and R means Thursday. The 'Note?' column tells when you should look at the footnotes below the table for more information.

¹The CRN is a number commonly used in university registration systems and is reported next to the course code and section number.

Chicago-Kent follows Illinois Tech’s system of registration priority, which is set out [at this link](#), as modified by Student Handbook § 3.2. In short, athletes, degree-seeking ROTC, and students with disabilities can register on the first day registration opens. On the second day that registration opens for the university, Chicago-Kent’s priority rule kicks in: first rising 3L and 4L students can register, then rising 2Ls, and then all other students can register.

Note 2: LAW 134-81, "Business Ethics," has a prerequisite of Business Organizations. This is a specialized section of Professional Responsibility focused on ethical obligations in business and transactional settings. Students within each priority group who are pursuing the Certificate in Business Law or the Praxis Certificate have priority. In spring 2026, Business Ethics will be taught online.

All In-House and Externship clinical programs are graded on a pass/low pass/fail basis only, with the exception of Pretrial Litigation, Intensive Clinic, and Intensive Clinic seminar, which are graded on a letter grade basis. Students are expected to put in a minimum of 182 hours (an average of 14 hours a week for 13 weeks) for 4-credit In-House Clinics and for Externships (in addition to the classroom component), and a minimum of 143 hours (an average of 11 hours a week for 13 weeks) for 3-credit In-House Clinics. Students must be available at the days and times designated below to meet with supervising attorneys and at other times as required by the supervising attorneys.

ADR IN THE WORKPLACE (2 credits)

Prof. Totonchi

Course number: 427-01

Monday, January 12 - Friday, January 16

Pass/fail not available. This intensive class explores the doctrine and process of labor arbitration, employment mediation and employment arbitration. Students will participate in selecting neutral arbitrators, prepping for and conducting labor arbitrations, an employment mediation and an employment arbitration. There will be comments, critiques and suggestions at every step along the way. The condensed schedule should help you focus on mediation and arbitration as you would in real life. Class will meet for approximately 21 hours during the week (the hours will vary depending on the day, and there will be no in-person class session on Wednesday in order for the students to prepare for the rest of the week), with approximately 6 hours of additional instruction through distance learning techniques. If you enroll in the course and later decide not to take it, you must drop it no later than Friday, December 27, or you will be charged full tuition for the course unless another student takes your place. Priority for this class will be given to students seeking the Labor and Employment Law Certificate or the Workplace Litigation and Alternative Dispute Resolution Certificate.

INTENSIVE TRIAL ADVOCACY 1 (3 credits)

Prof. Erickson and faculty

Course number: 541-01

Saturday, January 10 - Saturday, January 17

Prerequisite: Evidence. Pass/fail not available. This is an intensive week-long version of the regular Trial Advocacy 1 class. Classes will meet from 8:30 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. each day, including the intervening Sunday. If you enroll in the course and later decide not to take it, you must drop it by Friday, December 27, or you will be charged full tuition for the course unless another student takes your seat. Note: You must take Trial Advocacy 2 in the Spring semester if you take Intensive Trial Advocacy.

SECURITIES ARBITRATION (2 credits)

Prof. Gana and faculty

Course number: 541-01

Monday, January 12 - Friday, January 16

This course practically teach the workings of a Financial Industry Regulatory Authority (“FINRA”) Securities Arbitration. Students will learn how to conduct factual and legal analysis, analyze securities account documents, conduct legal research, develop case theory, draft pleadings and represent clients in securities arbitration proceedings before FINRA. The class grading will consist of a mock negotiation, mediation and arbitration for a final grade.
